From the Pastor:

It's almost Christmas and I just returned to the Church office after visiting some folks at Piedmont Hospital. It's no fun being in the hospital during Christmas. Some of you may have experienced that or had family or friends hospitalized over Christmas. Everyone is supposed to return home at Christmas. But some I'm afraid, are not.

Fortunately, we have family, friends, and even hospital staff who will bring Christmas care to us. They bear gifts, food, greenery, pray, and even sing for us. Most of all they bring themselves and are present to us in a special way. So, I guess, in that regard, it might be considered a blessing to be hospitalized at Christmas instead of another time of the year. At Christmas we genuinely see how much folks care. It's not so much the gifts they bring, but their care and presence that matters. When we receive love in this way, it helps us become more loving people. It heals us on the inside – the best kind of healing.

As we prepare for Christmas, let us be mindful of how God came to be present to us to reveal his love and care. Our savior's birth took place under very meager living conditions, less safe than in a hospital. We can't really say Jesus was home at Christmas – there was no place for his family in the Inn. Yet he was surrounded by loving parents, farm animals, and poor shepherds. The heavenly hosts filled the sky surrounding the manger, proclaiming the Good News of our Savior's birth.

From humble circumstances, Jesus would later grow up to reveal God's love through miracles and healings of common people. Great as they were, the miracles were but signs of an even greater healing – the cure of our souls. God's love revealed through Jesus' concern for all people was transformational. His presence and healing touch cured, not only their bodies, but transformed their hearts as well. With thankful hearts those healed would run about, witness and spread the good news of the Messiah's coming.

This Christmas, let us reveal the ways God has touched and healed us by being present to others who may be in need. Through your actions and presence, you may be the only Christ some people will see at Christmas – at a homeless shelter or even in a hospital. But that may be just enough to bring them relief, some emotional and spiritual healing and give them a thankful heart. That is how God's love for us operates, it makes us thankful and transforms our hearts. As God first loved us, so let us love others.

Knowing God's vast love for us through Jesus Christ, I wish for each of you a wonderful and peaceful Christmas and pray the Lord may touch an bless you in some special way in the coming year!
