Reaching Up To Christ and Out To Each Other February, 2025

From the Pastor:

I recently watched a podcast on the future of the United Methodist Church. Church consultants Doug Powe and Lovett Weems discussed the challenges and also the opportunities facing the UMC going forward. A lot of what they shared had to do with our need to remember our United Methodist identity. Following were some of their key points:

- The Methodist Church is an evangelical Church in a liberal tradition. John Wesley was a tremendous evangelist with a fervent desire for all people to come to know the love of God and God's saving Grace through Jesus Christ. Wesley had a famous saying with regard to how we share our beliefs and doctrine in response to God's Grace: "in essentials, unity, in non-essentials liberty, in all things, charity." While we may disagree on certain aspects of doctrine, we should still be charitable toward those with different opinions on doctrine and social remedies. The United Methodist Church has always afforded a big tent for discussions on matters of conscience.
- For Wesley and our Methodist tradition, simply having strong values is not enough.
 Holding to strong beliefs and morals without taking action on them reveals a weak faith.
 There must be evidence, we must bear fruit by reaching out with concern on matters of salvation, health, welfare and education. In addition to small group devotional meetings, Wesley organized missional and evangelistic outreach programs providing for schools, hospitals, care for the poor, children and even prisoners.
- With so much concern about Church decline today, we should regularly ask ourselves, "who is missing among the people God has given us in the community in which we live and serve. Who are the underserved??" At the same time, we should also remember that while many churches share a concern about reaching more young families with children, the fastest growing segment of our population is mature adults. We need to ensure our programs and outreach are tailored to the needs of those God has given to us in our community.
- We need to imagine all the ways our Church property and buildings could be utilized to
 meet the needs of our community. A few years ago, Epworth UMC partnered with the
 Rock Hill Dream Center to utilize our Fellowship Hall for afternoon programs for the
 youth of the Stonewall neighborhood. Both Cornerstone and Epworth have provided
 Church facilities for scouting and housing homeless men in the past. (cont'd on next page)

• Each Church is unique with its own "personality", strengths and weaknesses. In reaching new people, It is easier to utilize church strengths than to shore up weaknesses. Yet weaknesses should not be overlooked and are often revealed by asking the familiar question, "who is missing in our fellowship, among the people God has given us in the community in which we live and serve." To go along with this is a need to think like an outsider would think upon entering our fellowship. Who might they notice are missing among us?

As we approach a time of transition in pastoral leadership, let us continue to strive together to reach more people for Jesus with the resources, gifts and talents God has given us. Let us remember to do so as United Methodists with open hearts, open minds and open doors.
